Our golf begins on the West Coast of Ireland on the banks of Killala Bay at **Enniscrone - The Dunes**, a splendid layout finishing with four holes that parallel the Atlantic Ocean. **Carne** was the final course designed by renowned architect Eddie Hackett and he may have saved his best for last. Expect to face fierce breezes at **County Sligo** while **Rosapenna** is a stern test which architect Pat Ruddy routed beautifully through the high dunes. **Ballyliffin - Glashedy Links** opened in 1995 and is widely considered the nation's premier modern links.

Your accommodations are deluxe - and convenient to the courses. The **Mount Falcon Country House** is four star and family run, opening in 2006 on 100 acres of delightful woodlands. **Rosapenna**, nestled on the waterfront, offers the ideal setting to recharge after a round of golf and **Beech Hill Country House**, located just 35 miles from Royal Portrush, is the perfect place for the final three nights of your Tour.

Of course, **The 148th Open at Royal Portrush** is highly anticipated because the Claret Jug will be awarded in Northern Ireland for only the second time in history. Max Faulkner won here in 1951 and Rory McIlroy, Jordan Spieth, Dustin Johnson and golf's other great players will aim to add their name to the storied list.

Sightseeing Suggestion: Visit Sligo, a lively and attractive town with splendid shop fronts. It is also a significant cultural centre and has a fine range of art galleries and museums. Over 1,000 years of history have shaped the town, but it is literature that attracts many of its visitors. This is Yeats Country, and the subject of one of his best known poems is just outside the town, the Isle of Inisfree in Lough Gill. Sligo has many other attractions including its two fine cathedrals and Sligo Abbey; a Dominican Friary founded in 1252.

Carne was the last links course to be designed by the late Eddie Hackett and is now believed by many who have played there to be his greatest challenge. Carne lies in splendid isolation overlooking Blacksod Bay, affording little disturbance to the natural and unspoilt environment that surrounds it. Wednesday, July 17

Today play **Rosapenna - Sandy Hills Links (tbc)**. In many ways, the ideal of a modern links. Designed by Pat Ruddy and intended for the serious golfer, its narrow fairways appear constricting from the tee, but the landing areas sculpted from the dunes are deceptively wide. Measuring a hefty 7,255 yards from the tips, but a more manageable test of 6,356 yards from the white tees. Above all, the appeal of Sandy Hills lies in its beautifully balanced routing through the high dunes. Please note a very limited supply of golf carts are available for hire. Today play **Ballyliffin - Glashedy Links (tbc)**. This new course opened in the summer of 1995 and offers a modern championship test that is considered by many to be the best new links course built this century. Friday, July 19

Sightseeing Suggestion: Tour the area surrounding Donegal town. Visit Killybegs, a major port in the Irish fishing industry and very lively when the catches are landed. Continue to Kilcar, a centre for Donegal Tweed, where visitors can watch the weaving and buy the cloth. The Cliffs of Bunglass are one of the most spectacular views in Ireland

where the southern face of Slieve League drops sheer into the sea.

Sightseeing Suggestion: Enjoy a visit to Donegal, a thriving market town at the head of Donegal Bay, established as a Viking stronghold. The best way to see Donegal town is to follow the Tourist Trail, a sign-posted walking tour that begins in the Diamond, a square designed in the 1600s. The tourist trail is clearly signposted and includes such attractions as Donegal Castle, various churches and a Napoleonic anchor retrieved from the sea in the 1850's.

Saturday, July 20

Sightseeing Suggestion: Enjoy the delights of the Antrim Coastline. Outside of Portrush lies Dunluce Castle. The jagged silhouette of the ruins of Dunluce Castle rises from the cliff edge above the sea. Continue to the lunar landscape of the Giant's Causeway. Legend has it that the causeway is the work of the giant Finn McCool, the Ulster warrior and commander of the king of Ireland's armies. The causeway proper is the most spectacular series of geological features to be found along the North Antrim Coast consisting of 40,000 columns rising from the sea.

Sightseeing Suggestion: Enjoy a visit to Bushmills Distillery, the oldest licensed whiskey distillery in the world, established in 1608. Following your guided tour take a walk out to the Carrick a rede Rope Bridge. During the walk, along the Larrybane Cliffs, sea birds wheel and scream over the waves below. The Rope Bridge bounces and sways as one ventures gingerly along the planks above the rock strewn water 60ft below.
