Enjoy a scenic morning sail from the Atlantic coast up the Garonne River and into the very heart of Bordeaux.

Bordeaux's fortunes have long been tied to viticulture, beginning with an expansion of the wine trade with England in the 14th century. As a result, it is a handsome and cohesive city of uniform classical and neoclassical style, with monumental buildings and many fine estates financed by the almighty grape. The nearby countryside is alive with wine chateaux sporting impressive appellations such as Pauillac, Sauternes, Margaux, and Saint-Emilion. A visit is an excellent opportunity to learn more about wine production and appreciation, which of course requires a considerable amount of tasting to accomplish.

JUNE 19, SATURDAY: BORDEAUX, FRANCE (IN PORT / 2:30PM)

Enjoy a final morning in and around **Bordeaux**, before our mid-afternoon departure when we sail down river to the Atlantic and onwards to Nantes, France.

We turn inland again, this time up the Loire River en route to **Nantes**, a city known for Renaissance and reinvention. When the shipbuilding industry went bust in the 1980's, Nantes embraced the quirky and eclectic by inviting all kinds of artists, architects and inventors to create and captivate. The shopping you want is at the Passage Pommeraye: a grand 19th century historical monument that is home today to elegant boutiques, handmade jewelry and artisan chocolates. On the left bank of the river the ancient fishing village of Trentemoult feels suspended in time. The local specialty is monkfish served in sauce Nantais—a version of the classic beurre blanc. On the river's right side is the magnificent **Château des Ducs de Bretagne**, another designated monument that reopened in 2007 after undergoing a massive restoration.

GOLF: Today play **Golf Club de Nantes**. One of the first clubs in the region, Golf Club de Nantes was founded in 1921 with nine holes. It survived World War II despite the Germans whose enormous anti-tank fortifications transformed the landscape so thoroughly that the club moved to Vigneux de Bretagne where it was reborn in 1969 on a hilly, wooded site beside the Cens River. The route develops in a horseshoe around the historic castle of Buron.

JUNE 23, WEDNESDAY: ST. PETER PORT, GUERNSEY (8:00AM / 6:00PM)

Guernsey, or the Bailiwick of Guernsey by its official title, is a self-governing possession of the British Crown found off the coast of Normandy, France in the English Channel. It is a wonderful juxtaposition of England and France with an English lean by virtue of the Norman invasion of England in 1066. St. Peter Port overlooks the harbor, with rows of brightly painted houses, and terraced gardens. The island is ideal for rambles along cliffside paths and through the bucolic interior. While fishing, flower growing, and dairy farming are still important, Guernsey's favorable tax climate has brought an influx of offshore banks and insurance companies with their attendant bistros and boutiques. It was here in exile from 1855-1870 where Victor Hugo wrote some of his best-known works including *Les Misérables*.

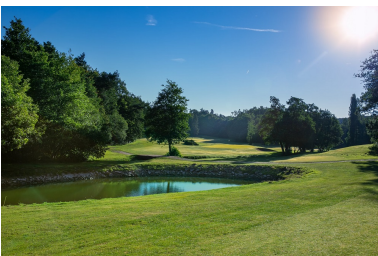
